I INTRODUCTION TO THE QUARTER-FINALS

It is with great pleasure that we welcome you to the EHF European League Women quarter-finals, on 18/19 and 25/26 March 2023. In the third season of the competition, the group phase has proven more exciting than ever and the eight teams to have reached the knockout stage have all shone.

For the first time in the EHF European League Women six nations will be represented in the quarter-finals: Denmark, Germany, France, Hungary, Romania and Norway. A total of seven nations were among the 16 teams that started the group phase in January, meaning only one country has left the competition: Croatia.

Among the eight quarter-finalists, three teams started their EHF European League Women journey in October 2022, in qualification round 2. Debutants Nykøbing Falster Håndbold eliminated Yalikavakspor Club and EHF Finals 2022 participants Viborg, and went on to top group C.

Women's EHF Cup 2018/19 winners Siófok beat MKS FunFloor Lublin and CS Magura Cisnădie in qualification, and Thüringer HC started with an exciting clash against Chambrey Touraine Handball and sealed their group phase berth against IK Sävehof.

The quarter-finals will begin with the first leg of the tie between SCM Ramnicu Valcea and Nykøbing Falster Håndbold in Romania on Saturday 18 March; the second leg between Nykøbing and Valcea will conclude the round on Sunday 26 March. Last season, Valcea were eliminated by Ikast, so are familiar with a Danish opponent at this stage of the competition.

In between, Siófok KC will try to become the first team to defeat Ikast Handbold this season. Sola HK meet Thüringer HC, and 2021 champions Neptunes de Nantes host BV Borussia 09 Dortmund in the last first-leg encounter.

Dortmund have already set records this season, by attracting 11,112 fans to the final group phase game against Siófok – the highest-ever attendance at a women's club handball match in Germany, and the biggest crowd in EHF European League Women history.

The quarter-finalists are playing for a place in the EHF Finals Women, to be held in Graz, Austria, on 13 and 14 May. Information on ticket sales for the thrilling finale to the season can be found on the official website, ehfel.eurohandball.com.

We pride ourselves with an excellent cooperation with media covering the EHF competitions both on the club and national team level. This document will guide you through the EHF European League Women group phase and offers plenty of information on all 16 teams and their players. I ALL EYES ON THE EHF FINALS

The EHF Finals mark the highlight weekend of the EHF European League season. The 2023 event will be held across the weekend of 13/14 May 2023 and will be the third edition of the final event introduced in 2021.

The third editions of the men's and women's EHF Finals, the final tournaments of the EHF European League, will be played in Austria and Germany this year, with Graz being the venue for the women's event and German club SG Flensburg-Handewitt hosting the men's tournament.

The decision has been announced by the European Handball Federation and its marketing arm, EHF Marketing GmbH, following a successful bidding process and subsequent confirmation by the EHF Executive Committee. The selections are in line with the overarching endeavour to host the final events of the EHF European League at neutral venues. SG Flensburg-Handewitt has committed to hosting the event, even in case the team does not qualify for the final weekend of the competition.

The EHF Finals Women are scheduled for 13-14 May 2023 at the Raiffeisen Sportpark in Graz, when the four title contenders will meet in the 3,000-seater arena. For the women's event it is the first time that the EHF Finals will be played in Austria, following editions in Baia Mare, Romania (2021) and Viborg, Denmark (2022). The four participants for the EHF Finals Women will be known following the quarter-final second legs on 25-26 March.

The premier EHF Finals Women were played at the Sala Polivalenta Lascar Pana in Baia Mare, Romania and saw the French team of Nantes Atlantique Handball becoming the first-ever winner of the EHF European League Women. Last season, at the Energi Viborg EHF Finals 2022, SG BBM Bietigheim celebrated the title after their win in the final against Viborg HK.

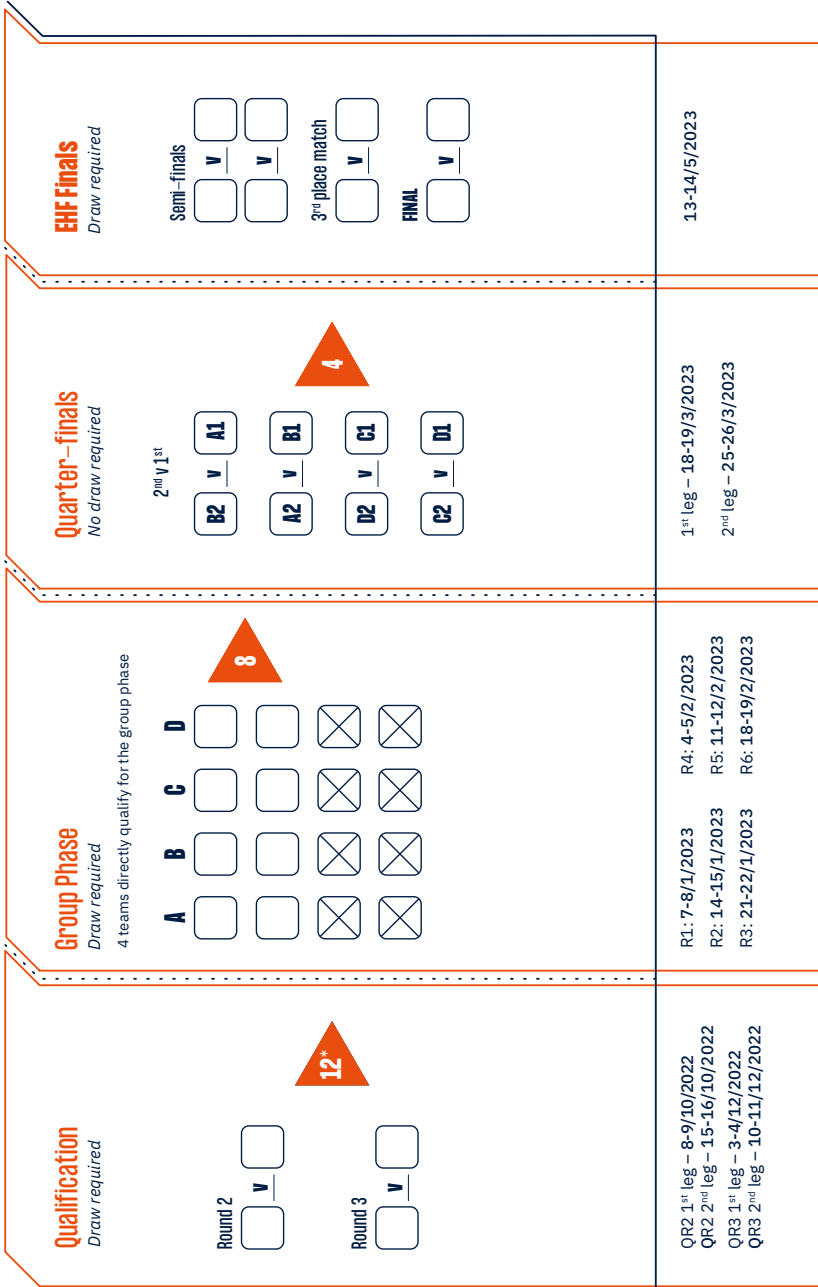

IKAST ON TOP OF ALMOST ALL RANKINGS

FACTS AND FIGURES: ALL YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT THE EHF EUROPEAN LEAGUE WOMEN QUARTER-FINALS

Eight teams from six nations are still in the race for the trophy in the EHF European League Women, after 48 group phase matches. One former EHF Finals Women winner and four more former EHF Cup Women winners are among the quarter-finalists. While a Hungarian player is top scorer of the group phase, almost all other rankings are dominated by Danish side Ikast. Here are more facts and figures on the second-tier competition in European women's club handball. Here are the most important Facts and Figures ahead of the quarter-finals:

1

for the first time in the history of the EHF European League Men and Women and Men's EHF Cup, the host of the final tournament is not participating in the competition. Graz in Austria will host the EHF Finals on 13/14 May

1 team is part of all three quarter-finals played in the European League women: Ikast from Denmark. The group B winners also qualified for both EHF Finals, but lost twice in the semi-finals

1 former European League winner is back in the quarter-finals: Nantes (2021). The 2021 runners-up Siófok, the last winners of the EHF Cup in 2019, have also reached this stage

1 participant of the 2022 EHF finals is still part of the competition: Ikast (third ranked). Last year's winners SG BBM Bietigheim played in the EHF Champions League this season, finalists Viborg were eliminated in qualification, and CS Minaur Baia Mare have not played in Europe this year

1 team won all six group matches: Ikast

1 of 48 group matches ended in a draw: SCM Râmnicu Valcea vs Thüringer HC in group D, 32:32

1 - for the first time in the new competition, Romania is represented by only one club and Germany is represented by two teams

1 group (C) needed to be decided by internal ranking, as three teams were equal on eight points: Sola and Nykøbing progressed, DVSC Schaeffler were eliminated

1 of four teams seeded for the group phase made it to the quarter-finals: Ikast. Debrecen, Molde and Paris 92 missed out

2 different nations and clubs were the previous winners of the European League: Nantes (France, 2021) and Bietigheim (Germany, 2022)

2 nations represent the group winners, Denmark and Germany with two teams each. No teams from the same country face off in the quarter-finals

3 teams made it from the first qualification round to the quarter-finals: Thüringer HC, Nykøbing and Siófok

4 of the eight teams were European League quarter-finalists at least once: Ikast (2021, 2022), Valcea (2022), Sola (2022), Nantes (2021)

5 group matches ended with a gap of 10 or more goals

5

of the eight quarter-finalists made it from the second qualification round to the knock-out stage: Sola, Dortmund, Valcea, Nantes and Nykøbing

5 of the eight teams have won European Cup competitions before: Ikast (under their previous names FC Midtjylland and Ikast-Bording) won the EHF Cup in 2002 and 2011 and the Cup Winners' Cup in 2004 and 2015; Siófok won the EHF Cup in 2019; Valcea won the Cup Winners' Cup in 2007; Nantes won the European League in 2021; and Dortmund won the Challenge Cup in 2003

6 nations are represented by the eight quarter-finalists: Germany and Denmark with two teams, Romania, Hungary, France and Norway with one club each. In 2020/21 and 2021/22 it was only five different nations

6 points from six matches were enough for Nantes in group B to qualify for the quarter-finals

7 nations were represented by the 16 group phase participants. The only nations which is out now is Croatia

12 goals was the biggest margin in the group phase, when Besancon won 41:29 at Molde and when Nykøbing beat Debrecen 34:22

15 times in 48 matches 60 or more goals were scored

31 of 48 group matches ended with home victories; 16 times the away teams were victorious

38 goals was the lowest combined score in the group phase, when Siófok beat Besancon 20:18. There were three matches with an overall total of 46 goals (Podravka vs DVSC 20:26, DVSC vs Sola 25:21 and Paris vs Valcea 24:22)

+42 is Ikast's goal difference after the group phase, which means they won every match with a seven-goal margin on average

46 goals were scored by Hungarian Csenge Kuczora to be the top scorer of the group phase - but as her club Vác missed the quarter-finals, she will certainly be passed by the likes of Iryna Glibko (Valcea/44 goals), Nathalie Hagman (Nantes/43), Asma Elghaoui (Valcea/41) and Annike Lott (Thüringer HC/41)

70 goals was the highest combined score in the group phase, when Besancon won 41:29 at Molde and Valcea beat Vac 40:30

147 goals were conceded by Ikast (24.5 goals per game in average) to have the best defence ahead of Siófok (149) and Nykøbing (151)

189 goals were scored in the six group matches by Ikast to top the attack ranking ahead of Thüringer HC (188) and Valcea (183)

2,690 goals were scored in the group phase, an average of 56 goals per game – and more than in 2020/21 (2,304) and 2021/22 (2,676)

11,112 fans attended Dortmund's final group match against Siófok in the sold-out Westfalenhalle to break the all-time attendance record for the second tier women's competition, and become the biggest crowd for women's club handball after the EHF FINAL4 tournaments in Budapest

- the French side were the first winners of the inaugural edition of the EHF Finals Women in 2021, beating Siófok KC 36:31
- one of three teams that have played the group phase in all three seasons so far; they finished the 2022/23 group phase second with six points after three wins and three defeats
- after failing to progress from the group phase in the 2021/22 season, Nantes got back on track this season, beating Motherson Mosonmagyaróvári in a direct duel for the quarter-final spot
- right wing Nathalie Hagman was the third top scorer after the group phase, netting 43 times
- legendary Danish player Helle Thomsen took over the team in December 2021 from Guillaume Saurina after being his assistant for a few months
- another German club was not an easy opponent for Nantes last season: SG BBM Bietigheim defeated them in the group phase and stopped Besançon Féminin in the quarter-finals
- Dortmund broke the record for the highest-ever attendance at a women's club handball match in Germany and the biggest crowd in European League Women history in their round 6 clash with Siófok, with 11,112 fans
- in their debutant season in the competition, 10 points earned them first place in group A after five wins and only one defeat
- Dortmund's previous best result was winning the EHF Challenge Cup in 2003 and being runners-up in the 1997 EHF Cup edition
- Yara Ten Holte was the third most efficient goalkeeper of the group phase – at 35.5 per cent save efficiency she stopped 61 shots
- three players are leading the way when it comes to scoring goals: centre back Alina Grijseels (24), left back Dana Bleckmann (24) and right wing Meret Ossenkopp (23)
- head coach Henk Groener took over the helm in October 2022 after Andre Fuhr left the club

- Iryna Glibko and Asma Elghaoui are in the race for the top scorer; they netted 44 and 41 times respectively in the group phase
- with 183 goals scored in six matches, Ramnicu Valcea was the third most efficient attack of the group phase with 30.5 goals scored per game on average. Only Ikast Handbold and Thüringer HC were better

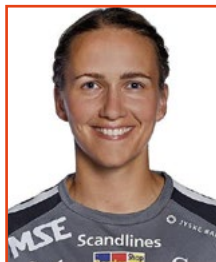

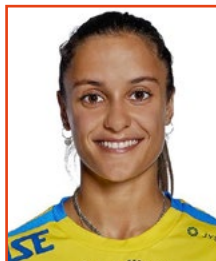

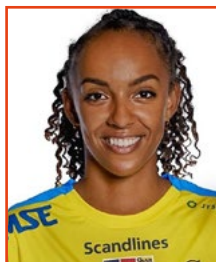

JOHANNA STOCKSCHLÄDER

 @johannastockschlaeder

Left wing

- was a “late discovery” for the national team, played her first international match at the age of 26 in 2021, did not play any youth or junior teams before
- the biggest surprise of the German team at the EHF EURO 2022, scoring 25 goals in six matches

Left back

- more a defence specialist than a back court player
- started her career in Brixen, Italy; transferred to Thüringer in 2016 and after two seasons and becoming German champion in 2018, moved to Metzingen
- returned to THC in 2021, as their defence specialist
- is an indoor and beach handball national team player for Italy, was awarded best defender at the Beach WCh 2014, was bronze medalist at the Beach EHF EURO 2011 and 2015
- was awarded Italian player of the year 2019



ANNIKA LOTT

Left back

- left her home club at the age of 16 to join Bayer Leverkusen, and became German youth champion in 2018
- moved to Buxtehude in 2018 and played four seasons for the Northern German side
- arrived at Thüringer HC in 2022 and is already best THC scorer in German Bundesliga
- had played in all German youth and junior national teams and had her debut in the women’s team in November 2020
- is a tall shooter, famous for long-range shots



SONJA FREY

Centre back

- played for Austria at the 2009 WCh in China at the age of 16
- a core player for the Austrian national team, coached by her club coach Herbert Müller
- in 2012, she left Austria to join Thüringer for the first time and for four years
- then made it to France, first to Dijon, then to Paris, before she went northwards to Denmark to play for Esbjerg and Ikast
- returned to Thüringer at the start of the 2022/23 season
- is a classical playmaker but also strong in one-against-one actions and is always among the best scorers

I IMPORTANT REGULATIONS

WHAT DECIDES WHEN TWO OR MORE TEAMS HAVE THE SAME NUMBER OF POINTS

All matches shall be played in accordance with the IHF's current Rules of the Game. Variations on a technical level are possible. All matches of the EHF European League shall be played in 2 x 30 minutes with a half-time break of 15 minutes.

The matches shall be scored as follows:

- a) win = 2 points
- b) draw = 1 point
- c) loss = 0 points

Teams' rankings are obtained by adding up the number of points won.

QUARTER-FINAL MATCHES

If, after completion of the two matches, both clubs have won the same number of points (no extra time will be played), the teams' standings shall be determined by the following criteria:

- a) goal difference
- b) penalty throws

RULES FOR EXECUTION OF PENALTY THROWS

- Prior to penalty throwing, each team shall name five players eligible to play at the end of the match by handing the referees a list of numbers. These players shall then take one throw each until a decision (a winner) is reached, alternating with their opponents. Each team is free to determine the sequence in which throwers will take their throws

- The goalkeepers may be freely selected from the match report and exchanged in accordance with the Rules of the game. Goalkeepers may take throws and throwers may

play as goalkeepers.

- The referees shall choose the goal at which throws are taken. The team taking the first penalty throw shall be determined by the referees by drawing lots. The team winning the draw may choose whether it wishes to throw first or last.

- If scores are equal after the first round of penalty throwing, it shall be continued until a decision is reached. In the second round, the other team shall start. Again five players shall be named who are eligible to play (the players named before may be named once again).

- In the second round, a decision (a winner) is reached when a goal difference arises after both teams have taken one throw each.

- Eligible players are players entered in the match report who have not been disqualified or suspended at the time of the final whistle.

- Serious infractions committed during penalty throwing shall be sanctioned by disqualification. If a thrower is disqualified or suffers an injury, an eligible substitute player shall be named supplementary.

- While the throws are being taken, only the player taking the throw, the current goalkeeper and the referees may enter the respective half of the playing area.

- If the number of eligible players falls below five, players may be named to take a second throw in the same round.
